SIGNS & SYMPTOMS

Baby's Signs:

Low/Excess Weight Gain- A common sign is the baby isn't gaining adequate weight or is the low end of normal in weight gain.

Unsatisfied Baby- Your baby may remain unsatisfied and may want to constantly feed day and night.

Colic and/or Gassy- Your baby may have unexplained and high pitched outbursts of inconsolable crying. The baby may require being carried in an upright position most of the time since this is the most comfortable positioning.

Reflux- Seen as spit ups with fresh or curdled milk where stomach acids ascend the esophagus into the throat area causing burning and pain to the baby.



Meet Dr. Sentelle & Dr. Rubin

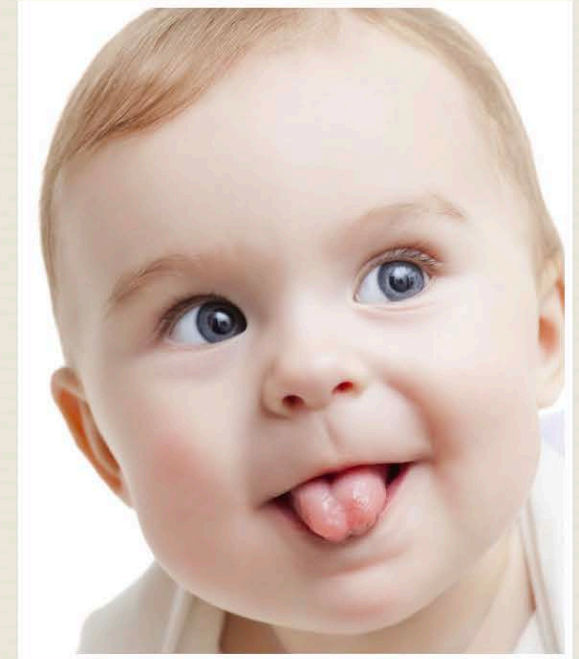

Here's How To Tell.



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Mother's Signs:

Painful Feeding- Experiencing repeated cracked or bleeding nipples associated with baby making a "clicking" sound when feeding.

Missshapen Nipples- following nursing may have lip-stick shaped nipples or compression marks associated with pain while nursing.

Breast Pain- experiencing engorgement, blocked ducts, repeated mastitis or a breast abscess

Low Milk Supply- noticeable reduction of milk supply over time due to inadequate milk transfer as a result of the babies ineffective sucking leading to pumping or supplementing baby with formula

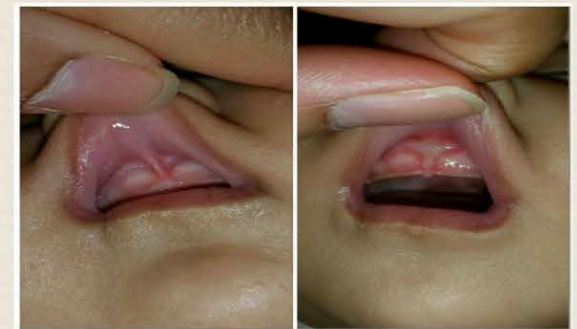


Lip Tie Before & After
